

## PHS Fall Garden Festival—Philadelphia Navy Yard, September 24, 2011

### BOUNTY BY THE BASKET

Entries accepted: 7:30 – 10:00 AM Saturday, September 24

Bring entries to the “Harvest Bounty” tent.

Entries in Bounty by the Basket must consist of at least five specimens of vegetable (specimen: an individual item, such as one eggplant), arranged for effect in a basket supplied by the exhibitor. Entries will be judged for horticultural perfection. The collection must be of at least three varieties (variety: a specific type within a species, such as one *type* of tomato or pepper or eggplant). No more than three specimens of one variety are permitted (exception: three clusters of up to five cherry tomatoes per cluster are permitted). All vegetables must have been grown by the exhibitors.

Note: The basket cannot exceed 30” in height or width.

Labeling: The collection must be accompanied by a typed or neatly printed numbered list (waterproof ink, please). One specimen of each species/variety must be labeled; press-on numbering labels are helpful. Specimens should be labeled with their correct botanical names.

Bounty by the Basket entries will be judged at approximately 10:30 AM in the Harvest Bounty tent.

Bounty by the Basket entries are eligible for first, second, and third place awards (gift certificates to Meadowbrook Farm, located at 1633 Washington Lane, Meadowbrook, PA, 19046, [www.meadowbrookfarm.org](http://www.meadowbrookfarm.org)). Only one first, one second, and one third will be awarded.

Entries must be removed from the Fall Garden Festival by 4:00 PM, Saturday, September 24. If they are not, they will be removed by PHS and the produce will be donated to the PHS City Harvest program to be distributed to a local food pantry.

### SALSA

Entries accepted: 7:30 – 10:00 AM Saturday, September 24, in the “Harvest Bounty” tent.

Entries must consist of three uniform jars of fresh salsa, packed in ice. Entries must be processed by exhibitors, but the ingredients do not need to have been grown by exhibitors. Entries must have uniform, suitable labels glued or taped to the side of each jar. Labels should indicate contents but should not identify entrants.

What the judges look for:

- Quality—perfection of materials.
- Flavor—jars may be opened by judges.
- General appearance—Uniformity of product, color, and arrangement in jar.

- Containers—Appropriate clear glass containers and uniform, suitable jars and labels. Jars must not be decorated.

Salsa will be judged at approximately 11:30 AM in the Harvest Bounty tent.

Salsa entries are eligible for first, second, and third place awards (gift certificates to Meadowbrook Farm, located at 1633 Washington Lane, Meadowbrook, PA, 19046, [www.meadowbrookfarm.org](http://www.meadowbrookfarm.org)). Only one first, one second, and one third will be awarded.

Entries must be removed from the Fall Garden Festival by 4:00 PM, Saturday, September 24. If they are not, they will be removed by PHS.
